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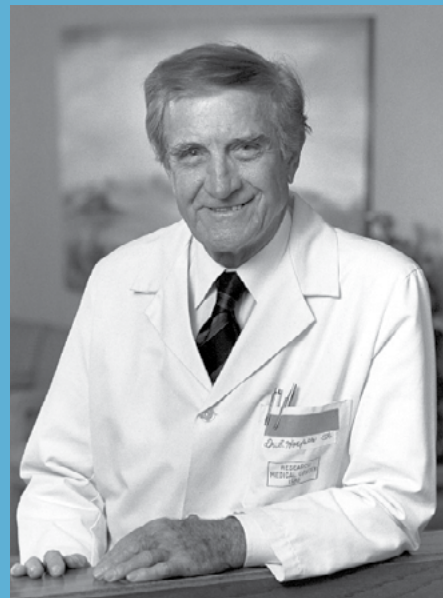

- Use the Reticulocyte count and the MCV to evaluate anemia
- Discuss studies utilized to evaluate a paraprotein
- Appropriately refer a patient with isolated thrombocytopenia to a hematologist
- State how disease prevalence and pre-analytic factors can adversely impact test utility and results

- State the appropriate diagnostic work-up for syncope
- Differentiate and diagnose specific common myalgia syndromes
- Initiate treatments that are successful in the management of common myalgia
