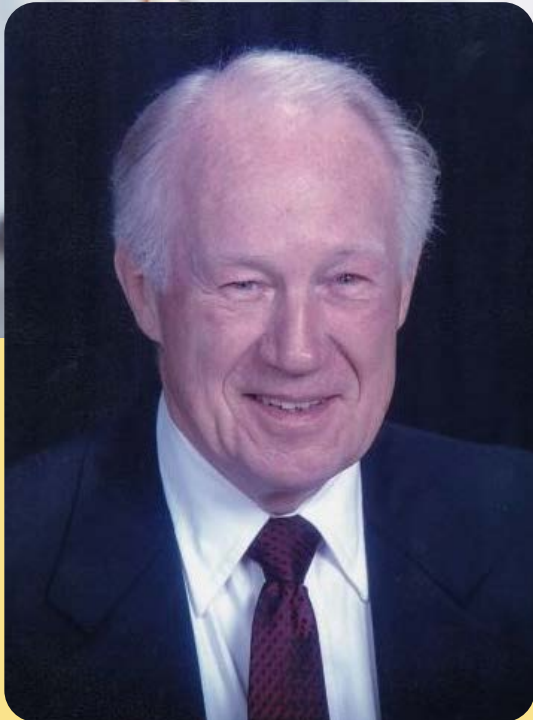

Dr. James M. Flynn was a pathologist who served as Director of Laboratories and Medical Technology at Research Medical Center for more than 30 years. He was also proud to have served in the US Navy where he became a flight surgeon and spent 21 years in the reserves, earning the rank of Captain. Dr. Flynn was actively engaged in community service and joined The Research Foundation Board of Directors in 1996. Dr. Flynn served in various leadership roles during his 22 years of service from 1996 to 2018. His leadership helped position our Foundation to make a real difference in our many health education and scholarship programs for the greater Kansas City community he loved. Dr. Flynn was appointed as an honorary board member to The Research Foundation Board of Directors in 2019. He passed away in 2023 at the age of 94.

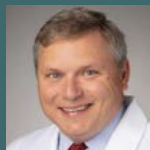
