TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience includes those involved in the care of Time Critical Diagnosis patients. This includes physicians, advanced practice nurses, nurses, respiratory therapists, and emergency medical personnel.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Review the early medical management of STEMI patients
- Review proper use of medications for STEMI patients
- Determine when to use lytics and when not to use on STEMI patients
- Discuss racial/ethnic inequities in stroke assessment and treatment and recommendations for improving care in under-represented populations
- Discuss barriers in stroke treatment for patients living in rural areas and methods being employed to improve access to timely care
- Identify signs and symptoms of stroke utilizing validated assessment tools
- Demonstrate knowledge of the difference between ischemic and hemorrhagic stroke
- Define cortical signs of large vessel occlusion
- Discuss considerations for routing to primary vs. comprehensive stroke centers based on assessment with validated assessment tools
- Demonstrate knowledge of acute treatment available for stroke, including:
- Use of thrombolytic agents (Alteplase and Tenecteplase) and inclusion/exclusion criteria for eligibility
- Mechanical Thrombectomy and inclusion/exclusion criteria for eligibility
- Use of intra-arterial Alteplase in patients with intracranial clots that cannot be mechanically removed
- Methods to control hematoma expansion in hemorrhagic stroke
- Review the clinical differences between REBOA and ED Thoracotomy procedures
- Describe clinical indications for use of each procedure
- Review recent literature supporting the use for REBOA vs. ED Thoracotomy
- Identify the signs of PTSD in the injured patients
- Discuss the impact and treatment options for injured patients diagnosed with PTSD
