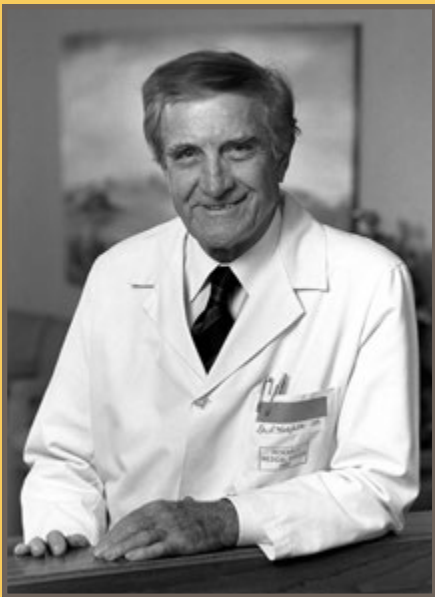

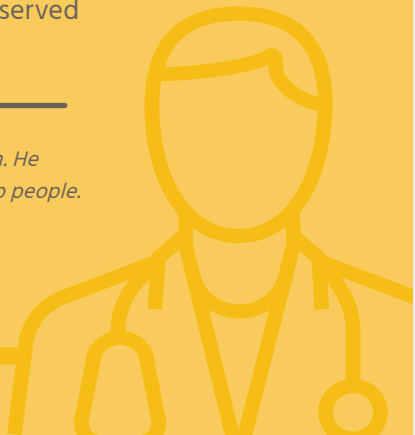
Dr. Sam Hoyer, Sr.

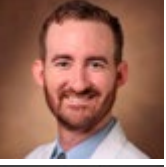
