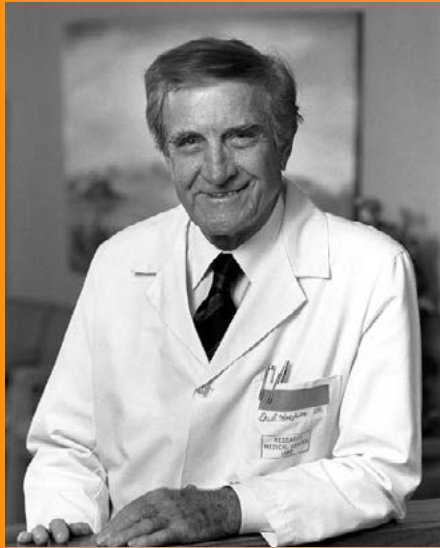

- State when to refer a patient to a hematology specialist.
- Discuss basic management for a hematology patient.
- Identify patients who need to be screened for aortic stenosis.
- Identify appropriate patients for TAVR versus SAVR.
- Discuss the management of patient with prior AVR.
- Discuss the emergence and evolution of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Review Covid-19 treatment options.
- Discuss Covid-19 prevention strategies.
- Identify the primary morphologies of cutaneous disease to help narrow differential diagnoses.
- Identify common cutaneous diseases that may present to the primary care provider.
- Review systemic comorbidities associated with cutaneous disease.
